Description:


Each student will make their own caps. The caps the students make will be used part of the performance with the book "Caps for Sale". Try to evenly distribute caps multiples of the same colors among the students.

The story specifically references these colors: gray, brown, blue, and red caps.

The "Caps for Sale" song is sung by the students and Darlene. The student's cap will be included as part of actions in the song.

Materials:

- 8.5" x 11" sheet of paper w Xerox of pattern on paper. (Cover stock or Construction paper work well) Cap colors required for program, are gray, brown, blue, and red.
- Scissors
- Stapler or Tape or Glue
- Markers, Crayons, paint, glitter, whatever you want to use to decorate the cap




Step One:

Cut "Bill" on the solid line Cut Line "A" on the solid line, stop at the dashed lines Cut Line "B" on the solid line, stop at the dashed lines



Step Two:

Fold "Bill" up on Dashed Lines



Step Three: Fold Down Tab "A" on Dashed Lines Fold Down Tab "B" on Dashed Lines	
Step Four:	
Staple, Tape or Glue Tab "A" to back of Cap	
Step Five:	
Staple, Tape or Glue Tab "B" to back of Cap	
Step Six:	
Check fit on head each child's head	
Step Seven:	
Decorate the cap if desired. Cap will be used as part of the performance with the book "Caps for Sale". The "Caps for Sale" song is sung by the students and Darlene. Each time the word Cap is sung the students raise their caps in the air and lower them quickly. When they hear their specific color in the song they also raise their caps in the air and lower them quickly (Lowering caps quickly allows the other colors to be seen).
